



Time Limited Options for Non-Fellowship Trained Physicians in Integrative Medicine

The American Board of Integrative Medicine (ABOIM) has created a new pathway for allopathic and osteopathic physicians who have not completed an approved fellowship to be eligible for certification in Integrative Medicine. The new Ayurveda training option and other non-fellowship pathways will remain open for a limited time only. The below pathways **will expire after December 31, 2022**



- A. Have graduated from an accredited 4-year naturopathic college OR
- B. Have graduated from an accredited Accreditation Commission on Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine (ACAOM) college OR
- C. Have graduated from an accredited Council on Chiropractic Education (CCE) college OR
- D. Have graduated from a Practitioner or Doctoral Ayurveda training program and pass the Ayurvedic Practitioner Certification exam from the National Ayurvedic Medicine Association Certification Board (NAMACB)

The options above will no longer be accepted after December 31, 2022.

Physicians who apply for certification after December 31, 2022 must complete an ABOIM approved Fellowship in Integrative Medicine to be eligible.
